READING BOOKS

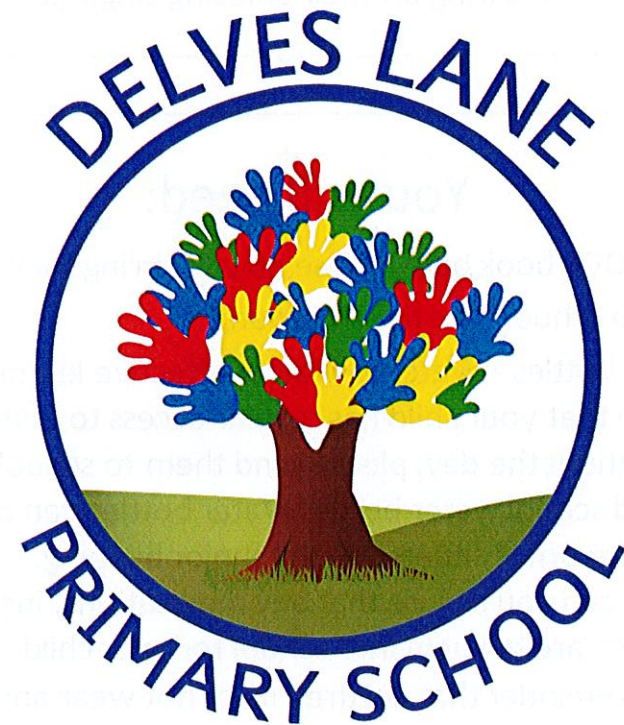
Children's reading books will be changed on a weekly basis. We would greatly appreciate your support at home by reading with your child regularly, practising sound books and signing their reading log.

Thank you so much to all of you who came to our Christmas Nativity last term! The children had great fun and enjoyed showing off their amazing singing!

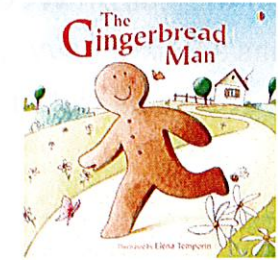
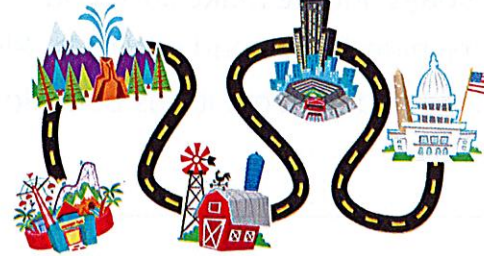


You will need:
